

Iznik is a town and an administrative district in the province of Bursa, Turkey. The town is at the site of the ancient Greek city of Nicaea, from which the modern name derives. The town lies in a fertile basin at the eastern end of Lake Iznik, with ranges of hills to the north and south. As the crow flies, the town is only 90 kilometres (56 miles) southeast of Istanbul but by road it is 200 km (124 miles) around the Gulf of Izmit. It is 80 km (50 miles) by road from Bursa. Iznik has a population of about 4,400. It has been a district centre of the province of Bursa since 1930 but belonged to the district of Kocaeli between 1923 and 1927. It was a township of Yenişehir (connected to Bilecik before 1926) district between 1927 and 1930.

Ancient Nicaea was ringed with walls that still survive to this day despite having been pierced in many places for roads. Inside the walls stands the Ayasofya Mosque where the First Council of Nicaea was held in A.D. 325.




CERAMIC ART IN IZNIK


meters and a total length of 4,970 meters, are generally recorded to be from the Late Roman period, although the exact historical date cannot be determined. In fact, the grid city plan in Iznik is evidence that the city dates back to the Hellenistic period, but the walls themselves are not from that time. Unfortunately, due to earthquakes and wars, there are no remnants of that period on the walls. In fact, the walls have undergone various repairs and additions over time, as seen in the Istanbul walls, consisting of three layers, with two layers forming a rampart and a ditch. Of course, the main reason for this design was for strong defense. You can even climb up to a part of the city walls, and it is a great feeling to walk on them."




LEGENDS OF NICAEA – THE LOST CITY UNDER THE WATER

The belief that there is an Atlantis-like sunken city lying beneath the waters of Lake Iznik is the most famous legend of Iznik. For centuries, among the fishermen of Iznik, there have been rumors that the city's minarets have been caught and torn apart by fishing nets and lines. Even the notes of Hoca Saadettin Efendi, who lived in the 1500s, contain sentences such as "When the water recedes during the driest months of the year, some large structures appear in the middle."









650 YEARS OF TURKISH BATH

Also known as the Grand Bath, this building is one of the three most important baths in İznik. Located on Atatürk Avenue, this bath dates back to the years between 1450-1500 and is also known as the 1st Murat Bath. The building has a double bath plan and the hot section is decorated with malakari. The bath features stone walls with brick reinforcements.

THE HAGIA SOPHIA MOSQUE




NILUFER HATUN TILE MARKET




